

## Pacific White Shrimp

Pacific white shrimp is firm, sweet and mild. Though it may be difficult to tell them from Gulf whites, if you look closely, you'll see that *P. vannamei* are creamy white, while Gulf whites are grayish-white. The *stylirostris* are often white with a greenish or bluish tint. Raw meat of both species is white but turns whitish pink when cooked.
